Core Curriculum for OH Nursing

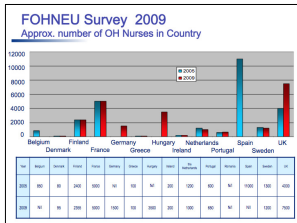
- This curriculum has been prepared for countries within the European Union
