We welcome poster abstracts from occupational health nurses and others in all occupational health nursing topic areas:

- Global Occupational Health
- Clinical Practice
- Disability Case Management
- Health Promotion/Wellness/Total Worker Health
- Chronic Condition Management and Coaching
- Management and Leadership
- Safety & Environmental Health (including regulations)
- Research/Evidence-based Practice
- Nursing Professional Development
- Interdisciplinary Health and Safety Programs and Topics
- Toxicology / Chemical Use
- Business Issues / Return on Investment
- Violence / Active Shooter / Disaster Planning
- Medical Surveillance Programs

Abstracts must:

- demonstrate a concise statement of significance of the topic;
- be applicable for the anticipated audience of **intermediate or advanced levels of practice**;
- focus on **leading-edge** subjects of interest to those working in any occupational health setting, including manufacturing, hospital/healthcare, government/military, education, etc.;
- be appropriate for both the OHN and the APRN audience;
- offer sufficient detail to demonstrate the relevance of the topic for presentation; and
- pertain to occupational health nursing research, evidence/solution-based clinical practice, disability management, safety, health promotion, business/management and policy initiatives.

**Guidelines for Submission:** The online submission manager can be accessed by visiting <http://aaohn.org/e/sx/eid=57>. To submit a poster abstract, submitters must first register as a Website Member. Once a profile has been created, follow the prompts to submit your poster abstract submission. If you have already submitted an abstract, you can review your submissions or submit additional ones through the close of the submission window.

*Please note: all abstracts must be submitted online and completed per the online submission manager guidelines, including completion of all required forms. Abstract submissions must be completed in their entirety before clicking "SUBMIT." You cannot save and reopen an incomplete submission form.*

**Deadline:** The call for abstracts will close **October 13, 2019 at 11:59 pm CST**. Abstracts that do not adhere to the guidelines and/or are received after the deadline will not be reviewed.

Abstracts that will score highest will be on topics that are leading-edge, evidence-based, forward-thinking and innovative, address mid- and advanced-levels of practice and are appealing to a large number of conference attendees. No abstract will be accepted that does not show clear and accurate interpretation of implications and recommendations for practice, education, research, and/or policy for one or more of the occupational health nursing subspecialties.

The American Association of Occupational Health Nurses, Inc.'s purpose is to provide evidence-based information with implications for occupational and environmental health nursing. Material presented at the national conference, available on the website, or provided in any printed materials must be evidence-based, of professional quality, and demonstrate an absence of proprietary or prejudicial/biased commentary. Anecdotal observations should be limited in their scope and not presented as proven fact. It is inappropriate to endorse or imply endorsement of any specific product or service. Presentations may be recorded.
